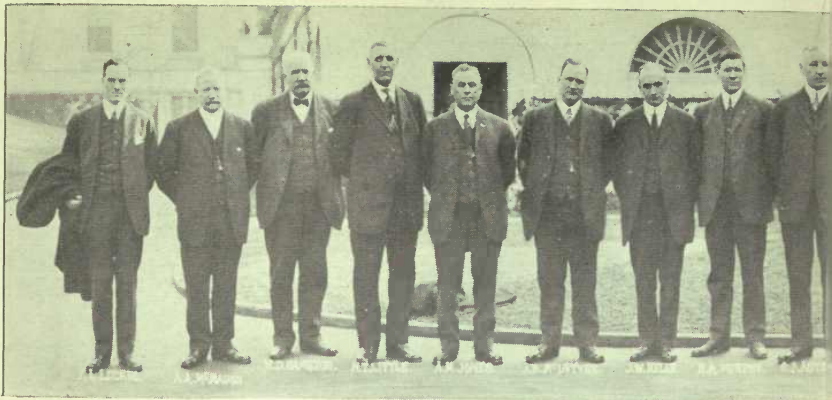
The association pennant, adopted at the Buffalo convention, held January 6, 7 and 8, 1891, must be of uniform size and color, as follows: Length, six feet; width, three feet six inches, and tapering to one foot six inches, with an eighteen-inch swallow-tail; to be made of red bunting, the figures to be white, one foot in length. The number of policy to be on pennant.

The pennant can be made any size by giving it the same proportions as above.

Note.—The Grand President requests all members to fly the pennant on their vessels.

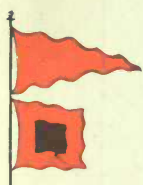

STORM SIGNALS

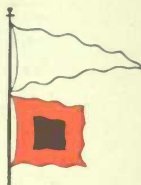
As displayed on the Great Lakes at United States
Weather Bureau Stations



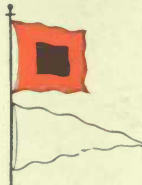
N. E. Storm.

Information signals (red or white pennant) displayed alone have been discontinued.

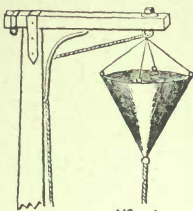
EXPLANATION

Storm Signal—A red flag with a black center indicates that a storm of marked violence is expected.

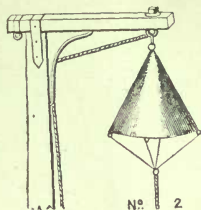
The pennants displayed with the flags indicate the direction of the wind; red, easterly (from northeast to south); white, westerly (from southwest to north). The pennant above the flag indicates that the wind is expected to blow from the northerly quadrants; below, from the southerly quadrants.

By night, a red light indicates easterly winds, and a white light above a red light, westerly winds.

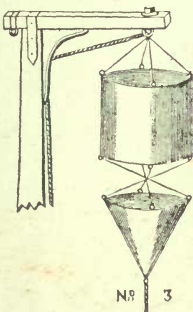
Hurricane Signal—Two red flags with black centers displayed one above the other, indicate the expected approach of tropical hurricanes, and also of those extremely severe and dangerous storms which occasionally move across the lakes and the northern Atlantic coast. Hurricane warnings are not displayed at night.



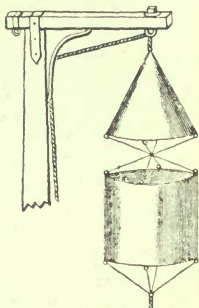

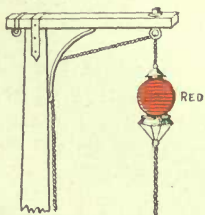

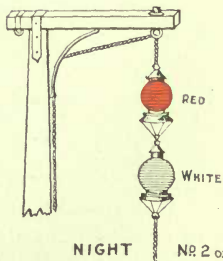

CANADIAN STORM WARNINGS.

Fig. No. 1.—This signal indicates the probability of a gale, at first from an Easterly direction.

Fig. No. 2.—This signal indicates the probability of a gale, at first from a Westerly direction.

Fig. No. 3.—This signal indicates the probability of a HEAVY gale, at first from an Easterly direction.

Fig. No. 4.—This signal indicates the probability of a HEAVY gale, at first from a Westerly direction.

The night signal corresponding to Nos. 1 and 3 is a red light.

Night signal corresponding to Nos. 2 and 4 is a red light above a white light.

NOTE I.—Mariners will be able to obtain further information from Signal Agents, or by consulting the daily forecasts.

NOTE II.—Mariners must always bear in mind that the storm signals do not necessarily mean that storm will occur at the place where the signal is displayed, but that one is expected either there or within such a distance that vessels leaving port would be liable to be caught in it.

Its Aims and Objects
Who Are Its Members

Extracts From Constitution

Article I—Purposes of the Association

Sec. 2. The purpose of this Association shall be to improve and elevate the characters of its members, to create a brotherly feeling, to visit the sick, render necessary assistance in case of death, to provide for a beneficiary fund, and to pay the same to the family of deceased members, or as may be otherwise directed.

Article V—Membership

Sec. 1. Every applicant for membership in this Association shall hold a master's certificate issued by the United States or Canadian Government, in force at the date of his becoming a member. He must also have been actively engaged in sailing within a period of two years prior to the date of his application for membership.

ADDRESS OF GRAND PRESIDENT.

To the Members of the Grand Lodge Ship Masters' Association, in Annual Session at Washington, D. C., January 27, 1914.

Permit me to bring you greetings and good cheer. Since last we met the snows of winter have gone down into the rivers; the ice has gone out of the rivers into the Lakes; the men have gone down to the seas in ships; the storms of autumn have come; the grim reaper has taken his toll of sailors; winter has again returned and we meet here in the capital city of the greatest nation in the world to take reckoning of what we have done during the year that has passed, pay tribute to those who were with us a year ago, but are no longer among the living, turn our faces rather to the future, and on the successes and failures of the past, plan and build for a bright future and greater advancement during the year to come.

In pursuance of our general purpose as already outlined, I wish at the very outset and before thoughts of more material things crowd in upon my mind, to pay due tribute to the memory of those members who have been taken from us during the year now past. The report of the Grand Financial Secretary will show the names of all of those brothers who have been taken from us, and I want it distinctly understood that I do not slight any one of them. I wish it to be understood that as the retiring Grand President of this Association, without repeating here their names, I extend to the members of their families the sympathy of this Association and in this feeble way express for myself and the members the respect and love which is well due to the memory of the departed. I cannot pass this subject without paying special tribute to the memories of Captain Higgle and Captain Bronson. Captain Bronson preceded me as Grand President of this Association. Captain Higgle was at one time Grand Secretary. Both were in their time active in the Association and helped in their day to make it successful and to preserve and develop it into the helpful organization which we are enjoying today. May the future bring us many members like these, who are willing to work for the common good of the members of this Association.

During the past season eight of our members were lost at sea—the largest number of deaths from that cause during any season or during any one storm. The annals of the Great Lakes will always record the storm of November 9th, 1913, as the worst in history. I at least hope that nothing that the future may bring and cause to be written in history will equal in severity, loss of life and loss of property, the storm of last November. I am sure that no one of our members who fought the battle of the waves in that storm will regret his membership in this order or the assessments which he pays for the men who were lost, but that on the

other hand, his membership in this order brought him much of consolation as, he thought of the loved ones at home, he was glad to know that if misfortune did overtake him, his many brothers who were more fortunate would each contribute their mite towards keeping the fire burning and the cupboard supplied when the check from the office had been stopped.

During the past year our membership has been increased by 102 members. One new lodge has been organized, namely, No. 15, at Owen Sound, Ontario. Orders have been given to install a new lodge at Fort William, and this will be done at an early day. The lodges have on the whole been active during the past year. I have so far as possible kept in touch with the various lodges, their officers and members. I have undertaken to keep a record of the various members who were active in the Association, but have found it very difficult to get reports and information in regard to these matters, and I do not feel that I would be warranted in making formal report on the meagre information which I have been able to get. In the course of the past year I have paid personal visits to several lodges. These of necessity were those nearest my home. I would have been glad to visit every lodge had it been necessary for me to do so. On every occasion when I have paid a visit to any lodge, I have been received with the greatest courtesy, both by the officers and members; and I wish now to thank them for their attention in that regard.

Before leaving the history of the year that is past I want to say that I have not been able to do all the things which I had hoped and planned, but that I have done the best I could at all times and in every particular. I have had the help of many loyal and enthusiastic brothers and an able and efficient corps of associate officials. To all of these I am very grateful, and particularly to Captain Chas. Auttonson, Vice-President, J. A. Holmes, the Grand Financial Secretary, and to Captain Murphy, Grand Treasurer.

Having thus briefly reviewed the year that is past, I have full faith and confidence in the Grand President and the other officers who will be elected to take up the new duties, and I have but few suggestions to offer, and those which I offer are not made in the spirit of criticism of any lodge or individual, but rather as suggestions which I hope may receive attention. I believe that the lodges would do well to give more thought to making their lodge rooms attractive so that during the winter months the members could find more comfort and more enjoyment in the rooms, and in that way be more likely to attend the meetings, and more likely to meet, mingle, exchange views and become, in fact, brothers. There is no class of men who in their daily active work have so little opportunity to visit and exchange views with others engaged in similar work. The best we can do is to give a wave of the hand or a "Hello, Bill," if we happen to pass close enough in the rivers,

but when the good old winter time comes, we do have time to get together if we want to, and I know of no better place than in the lodge room, and I know of no class of men to whom could come more good from such associations, than the ship master. The experiences of the one are surely valuable to the other, and it is not only a matter of good-fellowship and a matter of enjoyment, but it is a practical business proposition that we should meet with those of our own kind and those of our own calling and profit by what our brothers can and are willing to share with us.

Of course, the Ship Masters' Directory will be published again this year. Every member knows that the Grand Lodge of this Association is maintained by the proceeds from this annual and that the proceeds come from the advertisements contained in the book. Unless the expenses of the Grand Lodge are paid in that way, I know of no other way in which they could be paid except by levying a per capita tax; none of us want that to happen. The members of the Association ought not to expect that any one of the officers or in fact all of the officers should secure all of the advertising contracts. This is a matter in which all of the members are interested and every member ought to take an active part in it. Every member of this Association knows some one with whom he maintains such relations that he could go to him and ask him to take space in the Ship Masters' Directory. Will the brothers do this? I urge and ask them to give to the new officers and to the Directory of 1914 this degree of loyal support. You owe it to yourself, your brother and to the Association.

And now, as I lay down the gavel and retire from the high office to which you have elected me, I do so with a feeling of gratitude to all the lodges and the members for the honor bestowed upon me in placing me in the office and for the loyal support given me during my incumbency. I shall always think of the past year and of my relations to this Association, with great pleasure, and if during the coming year or during the years to follow thereafter, I can be of any service to the officers or members of this Association, it will give me great satisfaction and pleasure to do so. May the next year and each year bring new and added strength to our Association and may it go on without end, doing good to the masters and their families as it has done in the past.

CANALS FROM LAKES TO ATLANTIC.

The Canadian canals, which have made it possible for a vessel drawing 14 ft. of water to reach the Atlantic from the lakes, are as follows, beginning down the St. Lawrence river: Lachine canal, $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles; Soulanges canal, 14 miles; Cornwall canal, 11 miles; Farran's Point canal, 1 mile; Rapid plat canal, 3 2-8 miles; Galops canal, 7 1-3 miles; Welland canal, $26\frac{3}{4}$ miles; total, 72 2-8 miles. The River St. Lawrence with the system of canals established on its course above Montreal, and the lakes Ontario, Erie, St. Clair, Huron and Superior, with connecting canals, afford a course of water communication extending from the Straits of Belle Isle to Port Arthur at the head of Lake Superior, a distance of 2,260 statute miles. The distance to Duluth is 2,384 miles. From the straits of Belle Isle, at the mouth of the St. Lawrence, to Montreal the distance is 986 miles. From Quebec to Montreal the distance is 160 miles. Owing to the shallowness of the waters on a portion of the river between these two places, particularly through Lake St. Peter, vessels drawing more than from 10 to 12 ft. were formerly barred from passage for the greater part of the season of navigation. In 1826 the question of deepening the channel was first definitely mooted, but it was not until 1844 that any dredging operations were begun. In that year the deepening of a new straight channel was commenced, but the scheme was abandoned in 1847. In 1851 the deepening of the present channel was begun. At that time the depth of the channel at low water was 10 ft. 6 in. By the year 1869 this depth had been increased to 20 ft., by 1882 to 25 ft., and by the close of 1888 the depth of $27\frac{1}{2}$ ft. at low water was attained for a distance of 108 miles from Montreal to a point within tidal influence. This work is now being continued by the government of Canada, which in 1888 assumed the indebtedness incurred. The channel has a minimum width of 300 ft., extending to 550 ft, at points of curvature. It is lighted and buoyed.

Montreal has by this work been placed at the head of ocean navigation and here the canal systems of the River St. Lawrence begin, overcoming the various rapids by which the river channel upward is obstructed, and giving access, through the St. Lawrence canals, the Welland canal, the great lakes and the Sault St. Marie canal to the head of Lake Superior. The difference in level between the point on the St. Lawrence near Three Rivers where tidal influence ceases and Lake Superior is about 600 ft. The total lockage (or height directly overcome by locks) from tide water to Lake Superior is 552 ft. The number of locks through

which a vessel would pass in its passage from Montreal at the head of ocean navigation, to the head of Lake Superior, is forty-seven.

It is important to note that the enlargement of the canals on the main route between Montreal and Lake Erie comprises locks of the following minimum dimensions: Length 270 ft., width 45 ft., depth of water on sills 14 ft. The length of the vessels to be accommodated is limited to 256 ft. At Farran's point in the canal of that name the lock is 800 ft. long. A similar lock is built at Iroquois on the Galops canal, the object being to pass a full tow at one lockage.

Leading particulars of the Lachine canal are as follows: Length, $8\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles; number of locks, five; dimensions of locks, 270 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise or lockage, 45 ft.; depth of water on sills at two locks, 18 ft., and at three locks, 14 ft.; average width of new canal, 150 ft. The old lift locks, 200 ft. by 45 ft., are still available with 9 ft. of water on mitre sills. The depth of the canal between locks is now adapted to vessels of 14 ft. draught. The canal consists of one channel, with two distinct system of locks, the old and the enlarged. There are two lock entrances at each end. The canal extends from the city of Montreal to the town of Lachine, overcoming the St. Louis rapids, the first of a series of rapids which bars the ascent of the river St. Lawrence.

Dimensions of the Soulanges canal are: Length of canal, 14 miles; number of locks, lift four, guard one; dimensions of locks, 280 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise on lockage, 84 ft.; depth of water on sills, 15 ft.; breadth of canal at bottom, 100 ft.; breadth of canal at water surface, 164 ft.; number of arc lights, 219 of 2,000 candle power each. The canal extends from Cascade point to Coteau landing, overcoming the Cascade rapids, Cedar rapids and Coteau rapids.

Dimensions of the Cornwall canal are: Length of canal, 11 miles; number of locks, 6; dimensions of locks, 270 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise or lockage, 48 ft.; depth of water on sills, 14 ft.; breadth of canal at bottom, 100 ft.; breadth of canal at water surface, 164 ft. The old lift locks, 200 ft. by 45 ft., are also available with 9 ft. of water on mitre sills. From the head of the Soulanges to the foot of the Cornwall canal there is a stretch through Lake St. Francis of $32\frac{3}{4}$ miles, which is being made navigable for vessels drawing 14 ft. The Cornwall canal extends past the Long Sault rapids from the town of Cornwall to Dickenson's landing.

The Farran's point, Rapide plat and Galops canals are collectively known as the Williamsburg canals. Dimensions of the Farran's point

canal are: Length of canal, one mile; number of locks, one; new lock, 800 ft. by 45 ft.; old lock, 200 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise or lockage, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft.; depth of water on sills of new lock at ordinary water level, 14 ft.; depth of water on sills of old lock at ordinary water level, 9 ft.; breadth of canal at bottom, 90 ft.; breadth of canal at water surface, 154 ft. From the head of Cornwall canal to the foot of Farran's point canal the distance on the St. Lawrence river is 5 miles. The latter canal enables vessels ascending the river to avoid the Farran's point rapids passing the full tow at one lockage. Descending vessels run the rapids with ease and safety.

Particulars of the Rapide plat canal are as follows: Length of canal, 3 2-3 miles; number of locks, two; dimensions of locks, 270 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise or lockage, $11\frac{1}{2}$ ft.; depth of water on sills, 14 ft.; breadth of canal at bottom, 80 ft.; breadth of canal at surface of water, 152 ft. The old lift lock, 200 ft. by 45 ft., is also available with 9 ft. of water on mitre sills. From the head of Farran's point canal to the foot of Rapide plat canal there is a navigable stretch of $10\frac{1}{2}$ miles. This canal was formed to enable vessels ascending the river to pass the rapids at that place. Descending vessels run the rapids safely.

Dimensions of the Galops canal are: Length of canal, $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; number of locks, three; dimensions of locks (two), 270 ft. by 45 ft., (one) 800 ft. by 45 ft.; total rise or lockage, $15\frac{1}{2}$ ft.; depth of water on sills, 14 ft.; breadth of canal at bottom, 80 ft.; breadth of canal at surface of water, 144 ft. From the head of Rapide plat canal to Iroquois, at the foot of the Galops canal, the St. Lawrence is navigable $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles. This canal enables vessels to overcome the rapids at Pointe aux Iroquois, Point Cardinal and the Galops.

Dimensions of the Murray canal (extending through the Isthmus of Murray, giving connection westward between the head waters of the bay of Quinte and Lake Ontario, and thus enabling vessels to avoid the open lake navigation), are: Length between eastern and western pier-heads, $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles; breadth at bottom, 80 ft.; breadth at water surface, 120 ft.; depth below lowest known lake level, 11 ft.; no locks.

The Welland canal is too well known to require extended description. Its main line runs from Port Dalhousie, Lake Ontario, to Port Colborne, Lake Erie. The Welland canal has two entrances from Lake Ontario at Port Dalhousie, one for the old and the other for the new canal. From Port Dalhousie to Allanburgh, $11\frac{3}{4}$ miles, there are two

distinct lines of canal in operation, the old line and the enlarged or new line. From Allanburgh to Port Colborne, a distance of 15 miles, there is only one channel, the old canal having been enlarged.

It is but just to state that considering its population and resources Canada has done vastly more for its waterways than has the United States. The sum of \$75,000,000 is mentioned as a conservative estimate of the money which the Dominion government spent in its canals before a dollar's worth of commerce could adequately utilize them. No commercial enterprise in the world can tell a similar story of faith and confidence in itself. The placing of 14 ft. as the maximum depth for the canals seems strange in the light of today; but it must be remembered that when the system of canals was designed it was supposed that a 14-ft. waterway would be ample for all time upon the great lakes. The depth which at that time vessel men were looking forward to upon the lakes was a uniform one of 12 ft. The great steel carrier was not even a dream then of the most daring of minds.

Devil Island to Duluth.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course shown on Pt. Aux Pins Range.

Devil Island to Two Harbors.—Port $\frac{3}{8}$ point from course shown on St. Mary's River lower range.

Whitefish Point to Passage Island.—Port $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course shown with Round Island Range over stern.

Whitefish Point to Battle Island.—Port $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course with Upper St. Mary's River over stern.

Whitefish Point to Pt. Au Sable.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course with Vidal Shoal over stern.

Pt. au Sable to Marquette.—Starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course shown with Vidal Shoal Range over stern.

Whitefish Point to Huron Island.—Port $1\frac{1}{2}$ points from course shown with Vidal Shoal Range over stern.

Huron Island to Portage Entry.—Port $\frac{1}{4}$ point from course shown with Vidal Shoal Range over stern.

Portage Ship Canal to Devil Island.—Port $\frac{3}{8}$ point from course shown with St. Mary's River lower range over stern.

Portage Ship Canal to La Point.—Port $\frac{1}{4}$ point from course shown when heading on Pt. Au Pins Range.

Passage Island to Thunder Cap.—Port $\frac{1}{4}$ points from course shown with Vidal Shoal range over stern.

Courses On Lake Huron Using "Soo" River Ranges.

Detour to Middle Island.—Port $\frac{1}{4}$ point from course shown with Frechette Pt. range over stern.

Middle Island to Sand Beach.—Starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course shown with Middle Hay lake range over stern.

Sand Beach to Lake Huron light ship.—Starboard $\frac{3}{8}$ point from course shown with Frying Pan and Pipe Island in range over stern.

Nine Mile Pt. to Presque Isle.—Starboard $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course shown heading on Bayfield Rock range.

Detour to St. Martins Reef.—Same course as steered with Vidal Shoal over stern.

St. Martin's Reef to Round Island.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course shown with Vidal Shoal over stern.

Detour to Ducks.—Port $\frac{1}{4}$ point from course shown heading on St. Mary's River Upper Range.

Ducks to Cove Island.—Starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course shown when on Bayfield Rock Range.

Poes Reef to Cove Island.—Starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course shown with Flower Pot and Cove Island in range ahead.

Compass Courses on Lake Michigan, Using Known Ranges.

From Pt. Betsies to Chicago.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course steered through No. 2 cut in West Neebish bound down.

From Door to Chicago.—Starboard $\frac{1}{4}$ point from course steered through No. 2 cut in West Neebish bound down.

From Gray's Reef to North Manitou.—Port $\frac{3}{8}$ point from course shown with Gray's Reef Light Vessel and White Shoal in range over stern; or starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course heading on range of Chicago Water Works Crib and Chicago Pierhead.

Chicago to Pt. Betsies'—Port $\frac{3}{8}$ point from course shown with S. E., Breakwater and Chicago Water Works Crib in range over stern.

Chicago to Door.—Starboard $\frac{1}{4}$ point from range of S. E. Breakwater and Chicago Water Works Crib.

From Pt. to Milwaukee.—Starboard $\frac{1}{4}$ point from range of Gray's Reef and White Shoal.

Buffalo to Erie.—Same as range of pierhead light and town clock.

Buffalo to Fairport.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from above range.

Buffalo to Long Point and S. E. Shoal.—Starboard $\frac{1}{4}$ point from St. Mary's River lower range.

S. E. Shoal to Middle Gd.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point from course on St. Mary's River upper range.

Middle Gd. to Bar Pt. Gas Buoy.—Starboard $\frac{3}{4}$ point from Bayfield Rock range.

Bar Pt. to Toledo Light.—Port $\frac{1}{2}$ point course on Grassy Island North Channel range.

S. E. Shoal to Cleveland.—Starboard $\frac{1}{8}$ point from course on St. Mary's River upper range.

AZIMUTHS—A Correction of Compass Courses.

(Contributed by Mr. Arthur Dovale, nautical expert, Cleveland)

The United States hydrographic office recommends the use of the azimuth tables to ascertain the error of the compass as a handy method and one that will assist in relieving the masters of vessels of great responsibility. The only book absolutely necessary for working azimuths are the "Azimuth Tables" (H. O. No. 106, price 50 cents). It is also necessary to have the equation of time and the declination, which can be found in the weekly "Notices to Mariners." These notices are distributed free of charge by the branch hydrographic offices. Better than these notices, however, for working azimuths is a copy of "The Sun's Apparent Declination and Equation of Time" (H. O. No. 118, price 10 cents), as it is good for a whole year, and also has tables for reducing standard time to local mean time. The following examples will cover all cases required on the Great Lakes:

Example No. 1.

We will say that we are off Duluth on August 4, 1901, in latitude $46^{\circ} 45' N.$, longitude $92^{\circ} 7' W.$, variation $8^{\circ} Ely.$ (The foregoing can all be found from a chart). Ship heading $E. \times N.$ We then take the bearing of the sun (by the same compass as we took the ship's heading) to be $N. 78^{\circ} 30' E.$ and note the exact time by watch, set at say 90th meridian (central standard) time and find it to be 7h. 38m., a. m.

From table I, (H. O. No. 118) we find that the sun's declination for August 4 is $N. 17^{\circ} +$, which is of the same name as our latitude, therefore, we look for latitude 47° (as $46^{\circ} 45'$ is nearer 47° than 46°) and find it on page 107 (H. O. No. 106); then under the column marked 17° and opposite 7h 30m, we find the sun's true bearing.

Note "A"—Since the magnetic north is 8° east of the true north, the sun's magnetic bearing must be 8° less than its true bearing.

Note "B"—Since there are a less number of degrees and minutes from the sun's bearing to the compass north than from the sun's bearing to the magnetic north, the compass north must be to the east of the magnetic north; hence the easterly deviation. Had the compass bearing of the sun been N. 92° 18' E. then the compass north would have been 7° 06' W. of the magnetic north and we would have had 7° 06' W. deviation.

Off Cleveland, O., Dec. 31, 1901.

Latitude, 41° 30' N., longitude, 81° 40' W., variation, 2° 11' Wly.

Cor. for long.....+ 33 -20 (from table III, H. O. No. 118)

Eq. of time— 2 57 (from table I, H. O. No. 118)

From table I, (H. O. No. 118) we find that the sun's declination for Dec. 31 is S. 23°+, which is of opposite name to our latitude; therefore, we look on page 179, or 180, of H. O. No. 106, and in the column marked 23°+ at the top,

and opposite 3h 50m, we find S. T. B.=N. 128° 35'W.

UNITED STATES HYDROGRAPHIC OFFICE.

The United States Hydrographic office, navy department, Washington, D. C., maintains branch offices on the great lakes as follows: Buffalo, Post Office Building; Sault Ste. Marie, 17 Federal Building; Duluth, 1000 Torrey Building.

Masters of vessels are invited to call on arrival in port. Nautical charts and sailing directions on hand for inspection by the shipping public. Information affecting nautical charts regularly received. Nautical inquiries are investigated and answered. "Notices to Mariners," "U. S. Light Lists," and other periodical publications are distributed. Barometers are compared. All services are free.

Captains are earnestly requested to co-operate with the branch hydrographic offices in their work of collecting and distributing information useful to lake marines, by sending to them reports of buoys adrift, lights or gas buoys not lighted, shoals, wrecks, or any other dangers to navigation.

CARRYING MEMBERS AS MATES.

The following resolution presented by Marine City Lodge was adopted by the Grand Lodge, Shipmasters' Association, at its annual meeting in Buffalo, January, 1910.

Whereas, Several members of this Association serve in the capacity of mate during the sailing season.

Therefore, Be It Resolved, That members who are masters of ships, when in need of a mate, give a member of this Association the preference when it can be done, all things being equal.

SIGNALS—DECK AND ENGINE ROOM.

Rules and regulations of the United States steamboat inspection service relating to starting, stopping and backing signals for the great lakes provide that there shall be used between the master or pilot and engineer the following code of signals, to be made by bell or whistle, namely:

1 whistle or 1 bell	Go ahead.
1 whistle or 1 bell	Stop.
2 whistles or 2 bells	Back.
3 whistles or 3 bells	Check.
4 whistles or 4 bells	Strong.
4 whistles or 4 bells	All right.

Two whistles or two bells shall always mean back, irrespective of other signals previously given.

WIND SIGNALS ON LAKE SUPERIOR.

Winds expected for the western end of Lake Superior are announced by whistle signals of the United States weather bureau.

Signals are blown daily at 10 a. m. by the whistle of elevator "E," Duluth, Minn. The Imperial Mills, Duluth, Minn., also blow these signals at 10 p. m. during the navigation season, whenever the information then at hand is of special importance to vesselmen.

Force of wind.—Light (1 to 5 miles per hour), 1 long whistle; fresh (6 to 14 miles per hour), 2 long whistles; brisk (15 to 24 miles per hour), 3 long whistles; high (25 miles and upwards per hour), 4 long whistles; north, northeast, east, 1 short whistle; southeast, south, 2 short whistles; southwest, west, northwest, 3 short whistles; variable, 4 short whistles.

Duration of whistles: Short, 2 seconds; long, 6 seconds.

Examples:—For "brisk northwest winds" there is blown first a prolonged "attention" whistle; then three long and three short whistles. For "light northeast shifting to brisk westerly winds" the "attention" whistle is blown first and then one long, one short, three long, three short.

In Milwaukee 3 short whistles is the general bridge signal. There is excepted from this the bridge across the Menominee river at the foot of West Water street, and also the railroad bridge about a half block east of the West Water street bridge, as well as the bridge of the Chicago & Northwestern Ry. company across the Kinnickinnic, between Kinnickinnic avenue and Clinton street. For these exceptions the signal is four short blasts. Another exception is the Point street bridge, entrance to Green Bay canal, for which the signal is two short blasts.

AN ORDINANCE

Regulating the Harbor and City Bridges in the City of Toledo.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Toledo, State of Ohio:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to propel, or cause to be propelled, any boat on the Maumee River inside the City Limits of the City of Toledo, at a rate of speed exceeding Six Miles per hour. The provisions of this section shall not be construed as applying to passenger boats, sand-suckers or tugs. The speed of the boats herein mentioned shall not exceed Eight Miles per hour.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to cause any boat to tow more than one boat at a time through any draw-bridge in the City of Toledo.

Section 3. No bridge draw shall be opened for boats that are not propelled by power, unless they are towed by a power boat.

Section 4. The provisions of Sections 1, 2 and 3 hereof shall not be construed as applying to gasoline power boats and yachts, and the provision of Section 2 hereof shall not be construed as applying to scows.

Section 5. All city bridges shall be closed to navigation from the hours of 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 a. m., and from 5 p. m. to 6 p. m.

Section 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 or Section 2 hereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Passed May 20th, 1912.

On and after July 15th, 1912, this ordinance will be enforced by order of A. W. Boardman, Director of Public Service.

The following table was calculated to aid pilots in ascertaining the distance a vessel on a certain course will pass an object when abeam by bearings from the course of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $7\frac{3}{4}$ points. It is calcu-

To prove your calculation is correct and that your course is making good—that your vessel is not subject to the action of some unseen force such as current, or that your calculation as to leeway is correct, the bearing should be three points on the bow at twelve miles to run and four points on the bow at eight miles to run.

As another illustration, suppose the object bears $1\frac{1}{4}$ points on the bow at 16 miles to run the ship should clear by four miles, and to find if the vessel is making good the calculation and not drifting for any reason the bearing should be nearly 2 points on the bow at 10 miles to run and 3 points on the bow at 6 miles to run, $3\frac{1}{2}$ points on the bow at 5 miles to run and 4 points on the bow at 4 miles to run.

A bearing can be taken at every mile if necessary to ascertain how much influence wind or current has upon the vessel.

To Ascertain Leeway.

Take a bearing of some known object and as an illustration say it is one point on the bow with fifteen miles to run to bring the vessel abreast this object. This course barring leeway would bring the vessel three miles off. Upon taking your second bearing you find the object bears one and three-quarters points on the bow at ten miles to run, showing three and a half miles off. The vessel has drifted one-half mile in going five, which according to the table would be one-half point leeway. Taking a third bearing at five miles to run the object should bear three and a half points on the bow, showing four miles off. This course uncorrected would bring the vessel four and a half miles off.

The following table was calculated to aid pilots in ascertaining the distance a vessel on a certain course will pass an object when abeam by bearings from the course of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $7\frac{3}{4}$ points. It is calculated up to twenty miles.

It is also available to ascertain the leeway or current action to which the vessel is subject.

It will be noticed by the pilot that exactness depends upon his knowing the speed of his vessel and the time she is due abreast the object or his judgment as to the distance the vessel must run to bring the object abeam.

For example, suppose the vessel is a twelve mile boat and due abreast the object in an hour and twenty-five minutes (seventeen miles to run) and that the object bears two and a quarter points on the bow. Enter the table where the heading says "Difference between course and bearing $2\frac{1}{4}$ points" then follow down column to seventeen, opposite which is the figure 8, denoting the miles the vessel will be off the object when abeam.

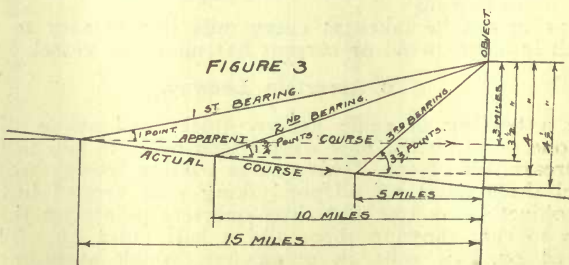
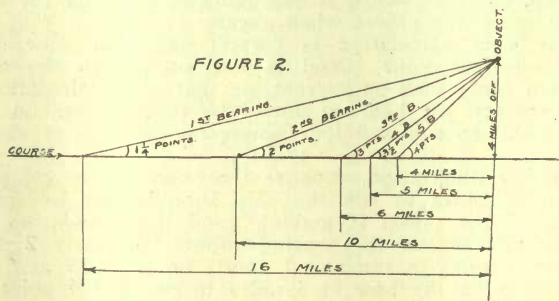
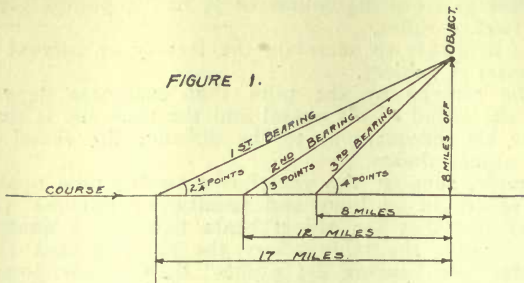

DETROIT RIVER POSTAL SERVICE.

REGULATIONS AS PUBLISHED BY THE POSTMASTER OF THE CITY OF DETROIT.

It will be necessary for boats desiring to receive or deliver United States mail to enter the American channel, but only at the point of delivery.

The station will be located at the foot of First street, and deliveries will be made as nearly opposite that point as possible by a launch and small boats, the service being a continuous one day and night.

When telegrams from passing vessels are handed to the marine letter carrier, the amount of money accompanying same, in addition to the cost of the message, should be sufficient to attach a 2-cent postage stamp to same.

The delivery of telegrams may be had by instructing the telegraph company to attach a 2-cent stamp to the telegram, and, for immediate delivery, the addition of a special delivery stamp.

Mail for delivery from the marine postoffice should be directed to the "Marine Postoffice, Detroit, Mich." and deliveries will be made throughout the entire period of navigation.

The signal to passing boats from the United States mail boat for delivery of mail will be one long whistle, one short whistle, one long whistle.

Signal for steam vessels wanting the mail boat to call for mail: One long whistle, one short whistle, one long whistle.

Signal for sailing vessels requiring mail boat: White flag by day, flashing bright light at night.

Signal from mail boat to large boats to check down: Three blasts of mocking bird whistle.

Signal from row boat belonging to mail boat when approaching vessels for delivery of mail: White flag in day time, swinging bright light at night.

IMPORTANT: Letters and packages will be received from passing boats by the marine carriers for registration and a receipt issued to the senders at the time, but registered letters and parcels can not be delivered to passing boats, as the necessary identification and receipts can not be had. The addressees of such letters and parcels are, however, duly notified by mail of their receipt, and that they will be held at the postoffice the usual time, subject to their order to forward or to deliver to some person ashore.

Money orders can also be procured through the marine carriers by following the instructions issued by the postmaster; if not provided with a copy of same, apply to the carrier.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For Navigating Lower Detroit River

Approved by the Secretary of War, October 17, 1912.

Definitions. The Lower Detroit River is that portion of the Detroit River between the Mamajuda range lights and Lake Erie.

Speed under these rules shall in all cases be speed over the bottom.

These rules shall replace all rules and regulations heretofore published for navigating the Lower Detroit River.

Rule 1. No vessel of 100 gross tons or over shall navigate the Livingstone Channel at a rate of speed greater than ten statute miles per hour between its junction with the Amherstburg Channel at Ballards Reef and the Bar Point light vessel; nor the Amherstburg Channel at a rate of speed greater than twelve statute miles per hour between the south end of Bois Blanc Island and the north gas buoys at Ballards Reef, and where the width of this channel is restricted by improvements in progress, through such restricted width of channel the speed shall not exceed eight statute miles per hour.

Rule 2. Downbound freight vessels shall pass through the Livingstone Channel and enter Lake Erie via the channel west of Detroit River lighthouse. All upbound vessels shall enter Detroit River via the channel east of Detroit River lighthouse, and pass through the Amherstburg Channel.

Vessels under 100 gross tons, and vessels making local stops along these routes, are exempt from this rule.

Rule 3. Passenger vessels may use the Amherstburg Channel downbound, but should they pass down through the Livingstone Channel they shall be subject to the rules governing that channel.

Rule 4. All upbound light-draft vessels and all passenger vessels using the Amherstburg Channel shall pass through the auxiliary channel to the eastward of the improved channel at Ballards Reef. This auxiliary channel is 280 ft. wide and 14.5 ft. deep at low-water datum. The depth of water in this channel is posted in the cupola of building occupied by Duff and Gatfield, marine reporters, at Texas Dock.

Rule 5. No vessel shall pass, or approach within one-quarter mile of another vessel bound in the same direction in that portion of Livingstone Channel between its junction with the Amherstburg Channel at Ballards Reef and Bar Point light vessel; nor at any other portion of either channel where the width of channel is restricted by improvements in progress.

Tugs without tows and vessels under 100 gross tons are exempt from this rule.

Rule 6. Any vessel approaching a tug with a tow moving in the same direction may pass such tow by giving a signal indicating upon which side the vessel desires to pass, and it shall be the duty of the pilot of the tug to sheer clear of the side of the channel indicated and give the passing vessel all possible room.

Rule 7. No vessel shall anchor within the limits of either channel except in distress or under stress of weather. Any vessel so anchored shall be moved as quickly as possible to such anchorage as will leave the channel clear for the passage of vessels.

Rule 8. No vessel shall tow another through any of the improved channels unless such vessel moves the tow at least five miles per hour over the bottom; and no vessel of ten gross tons or over shall navigate the improved channels under sail power alone.

Rule 9. All vessels passing dredges, drill scows, derrick scows, or other stationary plant engaged on improvements to the channels are required to slacken their speed when given a signal by three distinct blasts of the steam whistle.

Rule 10. No vessel shall pass or attempt to pass another vessel or vessels moving in the same or opposite directions at any place in Lower Detroit River, in such a position that more than two vessels will be abreast when passing.

Rule 11. Three long blasts of the steam whistle, when sounded from a patrolling vessel, will indicate that the vessel to which such signal is given is proceeding at too high a rate of speed, and such vessel must immediately moderate her speed accordingly.

Rule 12. Four long blasts of the steam whistle, when sounded from a patrolling vessel, will indicate that the vessel to which such signal is given must stop until further orders from the patrolling vessel.

Rule 13. One long blast followed by four short blasts, when sounded from a patrolling vessel, will indicate that the vessel to which such signal is given may proceed on her course.

Rule 14. A vessel aground in or near a channel, or a vessel which from any accident is not under command, shall show from sunset to sunrise, at a height of not less than twenty feet nor more than forty feet above the hull, two lights in a vertical line one above the other and not less than six feet apart, and so fixed as to be visible to both up and downbound vessels. The upper of these lights shall be red. If the nature of the accident is such that the channel is closed, the lower of these lights shall also be red. But if the nature of the accident is such that vessels can pass in safety, the lower of these lights shall be white.

Such vessel shall not show the lights required for a vessel at anchor.

Such vessel shall, if the accident has closed the channel, sound a signal of several short and rapid blasts of the steam whistle to any approaching vessel, whereupon the approaching vessel shall stop and repeat this signal to any vessel coming up astern of her.

But if the accident has not rendered passing unsafe, such vessel shall sound a signal of three distinct blasts to any approaching vessel, whereupon the approaching vessel shall answer with the same signal of three distinct blasts and shall reduce her speed and pass with caution.

Such vessel shall in no case give or answer a passing signal without first giving several short and rapid blasts of the steam whistle.

It shall be the duty of the Master of the first vessel passing such vessel to report the place and nature of the accident to the next marine reporting station or patrol boat.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR NAVIGATING THE SAINT CLAIR RIVER, MICH., IN THE VICINITY OF STAG ISLAND.

The United States Government having improved the channel to the westward of Stag Island by the removal of shoals, the following regulation is promulgated by the Secretary of War in pursuance of the provisions of Section 4 of the river and harbor act of August 18, 1894, as amended by Section 11 of the river and harbor act of June 13, 1902.

All through-bound vessels in passing through the river at this point shall keep to the right, that is to say, all up-bound boats shall pass through the eastern channel and all down-bound boats through the western channel.

This rule shall only apply to through-bound vessels and not to vessels running between local points on the river, which vessels may take either channel, conforming to the ordinary rules of the road at sea.

The following regulation governing the speed of vessels navigating the St. Clair river in front of Sarnia has been approved by both the United States and Dominion Governments:

The speed of vessels navigating the waters of St. Clair river in front of the city of Sarnia shall not exceed nine miles per hour.

The city limits of Sarnia extend from just below the international tunnel to about opposite Bay Point.

War Department Sept. 16, 1909.

The Canadian Government have concurred in the foregoing regulations for the navigation of the St. Clair River.

Penalties for Violations.

Every person and every corporation which shall violate such rules and regulations shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction thereof in any district court of the United States within whose territorial jurisdiction such offense may have been committed, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment (in case of a natural person) not exceeding six months, in the discretion of the court.

REGULATIONS FOR CHICAGO HARBOR.

Ordinance passed Dec. 13th, 1909, amending Section 1016 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, as follows:

Section 1016. Steam Tugs for Vessels—Penalty. All vessels, craft or floats not propelled by steam, navigating the harbor for which the opening of any bridge may be necessary, shall, while approaching and passing such bridge be towed by a steam tug. Any steam boat, vessel, craft or float propelled by steam of twelve hundred (1,200) tons gross burden or more, while navigating the portion of the Chicago River bounded by the Rush street bridge on the east, the Twelfth street bridge on the south and the Chicago avenue bridge on the north, all inclusive, shall have the assistance of a tug or tugs. It shall be unlawful for any steam boat, vessel, craft or float of twelve hundred (1,200) tons gross burden or more to back through any bridge draw in the Chicago River or the Calumet River within the limits of the City of Chicago without the assistance of a tug or tugs. Page 2139 Council Proceedings.

The mayor of Chicago has suspended this ordinance pending court decision on litigation so that it is not obligatory on a vessel master to take a tug on the Chicago river unless he thinks it necessary to do so.

RULES FOR THE SAINT MARY'S RIVER.

Rule 1. These rules shall apply to the waters of Saint Mary's River from Point Iroquois on Lake Superior to Point Detour on Lake Huron, except those waters included in the Saint Mary's Falls Canals.

Speed under these rules shall in all cases be speed over the bottom.

Rule 2. No vessel of 500 gross tons or over shall navigate the Saint Mary's River at a rate of speed greater than ten statute miles per hour between Everen's Point and the float lights in Hay Lake marking the northern end of the Middle Neebish Channel, nor between the post lights in Hay Lake and in Mud Lake marking the upper and lower ends, respectively, of the West Neebish Channel, nor between Six Mile Point Rear Light and the intersection of Cedar Point and Birch Point Ranges.

Rule 3. No vessel of 500 gross tons or over shall pass up the West Neebish Channel nor down the Middle Neebish Channel except vessels making a regular local stop on these channels and vessels bound in or out of the Saint Joseph or Lake George Channels at Harwood Point.

Rule 4. No vessel shall pass, or approach within one-quarter mile of, a vessel bound in the same direction in any of those portions of the channels where speed is restricted to ten statute miles per hour except between Bayfield Rock and the Saint Mary's Falls Canals, and, for upbound vessels only, between Vidal Shoal and Black Gas Buoy No. 3, off Brush Point.

Tugs without tows and local passenger boats under 500 gross tons are exempt from this rule.

Rule 5. Any vessel approaching a tug towing a dredge or scow moving in the same direction may pass such tow by giving a signal indicating upon which side the vessel desires to pass, and it shall be the duty of the pilot of the tug to sheer clear of the side of the channel indicated and give the vessel all possible room.

Rule 6. No vessel or raft shall anchor in any of the improved channels nor off Big Point within one-quarter mile of the waterworks intake crib, except vessels in distress or under stress of weather.

Any vessel or raft so anchored shall at once shift anchorage as directed by the Supervisor of Anchorages.

Rule 7. Vessels towing, while engaged in shortening or lengthening tow lines, or dropping or making up tows; vessels mooring or unmooring, anchoring or hoisting anchor; vessels loading or discharging stores from boats alongside; and vessels awaiting supply boats are required to haul, clear of the range when possible and to permit the unobstructed passage of other vessels.

Rule 8. No vessel is allowed to tow more than one vessel through any of the improved channels unless the vessel moves the

tow at least five miles per hour over the bottom; and no vessel of ten gross or over shall navigate the improved channels under sail power alone.

Rule 9. Every upbound vessel shall, when abreast of Everen's Point, sound a ten-second blast of the steam whistle, which shall be answered by any descending vessel between Dark Hole Gas Buoy and Johnston Point.

Every vessel bound down the Middle Necbish Channel shall, when abreast of Dark Hole Gas Buoy, sound a ten-second blast of the steam whistle, which shall be answered by a like blast from any upbound vessel between Everen's Point and Johnston's Point

Immediately after such exchange of signals the passing signals shall be exchanged.

Masters are cautioned not to sound the ten-second blast required by this rule before reaching the points named.

Rule 10. All vessels passing dredges and other vessels engaged on improvements to the channels are required to slacken their speed upon such dredge or vessel giving the signal of three distinct blasts of the steam whistle.

Rule 11. No vessel shall pass or attempt to pass another vessel or vessels moving in the same direction in such a position that more than two vessels will be abreast when passing.

Rule 12. Rafts are required to use the Old or Lake George Channel. When lying by they shall be moored clear of the channel. From Harwood Point to Mud Lake Crib Gas Buoy they will move only when and as directed by the Supervisor of Anchorages.

Rafts originating in Hay Lake shall be moved only at such times and under such conditions as the Supervisor of Anchorages may direct.

Rule 13. A vessel aground in or near a channel, or a vessel which from any accident is not under command, shall show from sunset to sunrise, at a height of not less than twenty feet nor more than forty feet above the hull, two lights in a vertical line one above the other and not less than six feet apart and so fixed as to be visible to both up and down bound vessels. The upper of these lights shall be red. If the nature of the accident is such that the channel is closed, the lower of these lights shall be red. But if the nature of the accident is such that vessels can pass in safety, the lower of these lights shall be white.

Such vessel shall not show the lights required for a vessel at anchor.

Such vessel shall, if the accident has closed the channel, sound a signal of several short and rapid blasts of the steam whistle to any approaching vessel, whereupon the approaching vessel shall stop and shall repeat this signal to any vessel coming up astern of her.

But if the accident has not rendered passing unsafe, such vessel may sound a signal of three distinct blasts to any approaching vessel, whereupon the approaching vessel shall answer with the same signal of three distinct blasts and shall reduce her speed and pass with caution.

Such vessel shall in no case give or answer a passing signal without first giving several short and rapid blasts of the steam whistle.

And it shall be the duty of the master of the first vessel passing such vessel to report the place and nature of the accident to the next lookout station, canal office, or patrol boat.

Rule 14. Whenever vessels collect in any part of the river by reason of fog, smoke, ice, or the obstruction of any of the channels, the Supervisor of Anchorages shall direct and control their anchorage and their movements through such channels as the Engineer in charge of the improvements of the Saint Mary's River may declare open and under such restrictions as to order, speed, and towage as the Engineer in charge of the improvements in the Saint Mary's River may deem necessary to facilitate and expedite the passage of commerce. Regular scheduled boats carrying passengers or mails may be advanced in order and any vessel not ready to move when directed will lose her position. All vessels are required to yield prompt and implicit obedience to the directions of the Supervisor of Anchorages.

Rule 15. The patrolling vessels of the United States Revenue-Cutter Service shall have the right of way over all other vessels.

Rule 16. Signals will be used by patrol vessels as follows:

One long blast of the steam whistle followed by one short blast calls attention of nearest patrol boat or lookout station. This signal will also be used by any vessel that wishes to speak to a patrol boat.

Three long blasts of the steam whistle will indicate that the nearest moving vessel is proceeding at too high a rate of speed, and such vessel will at once reduce her speed.

Four long blasts of the steam whistle will indicate that the nearest moving vessel must stop until further orders.

Rule 17. Day and night signals will be displayed from the signal pole at Lookout Station No. 1, Johnson's Point, as follows:

One red light by night or one red ball by day will indicate that the depth of water in the channel is below the normal, and the master of any vessel the draft of which approximates the normal depth will ascertain the depth of water existing in the channel before attempting its passage.

Two red lights by night or two red balls by day will indicate that the channel is closed to upbound vessels, and all such vessels will anchor in the order of their arrival, unless otherwise directed by the patrol boat, on the west side of the ranges from the Mill

dock to Everen's Point and on the east side of the sailing lines in Mud Lake below Mud Lake Crib Gas Buoy, and will so remain anchored as long as these signals are displayed.

Rule 18. The signal of two red lights by night or two red balls by day may be used by the patrol boats or by lookout stations other than No. 1 to signify that vessels approaching a blockaded channel must anchor where designated and so remain anchored until further instructed by a patrol boat.

Rule 19. A white light hoisted on the flagstaff of any lookout station by night or a white flag or ball hoisted under the ensign by day will signify that the lookout has instructions for passing vessels.

Rule 20. The foregoing rules shall not apply to motor boats as defined under the act of Congress approved June 9, 1910, or to sail vessels under ten gross tons.

Rule 21. In all cases where the foregoing rules are not applicable the attention of masters is directed to the Pilot Rules for the Great Lakes and their Connecting and Tributary Waters.

Complaints arising under these rules should be addressed to the "Supervisor of Anchorages, Sault Sainte Marie, Michigan."

Appeals from the assessments of fines will be accompanied by sworn statements in duplicate. They will be addressed to "The Honorable, The Secretary of Commerce and Labor," and must be forwarded through the collector of customs that assessed the fine.

These rules will take effect April 15th, 1911.

Rules and Regulations in case of obstructions to commerce in St. Mary's River, Michigan, prescribed by the Secretary of War Jan. 9, 1907.

Under authority of Section 4 of the River and Harbor act of August 18, 1894, as amended by Section 11 of the River and Harbor act of June 13, 1902, the following rules and regulations in case of obstructions to commerce in the St. Mary's River, Michigan, are hereby prescribed:

Whenever any boat, vessel, raft, or other water craft, shall, by reason of grounding, becoming fast in ice, or any other cause, endanger, or obstruct, the free passage of vessels, the Engineer Officer in charge of the improvement of St. Mary's River, Michigan, or his duly accredited representative, is hereby authorized to take immediate charge with full power to stop all vessels and direct their anchorage; to clear a channel; to designate the order in which all vessels shall proceed after the channel is opened; and to do all other things necessary and proper to facilitate and expedite the passage of commerce.

While in the performance of this duty all orders of the Engineer Officer, or his agent, shall be obeyed, and any violation of such orders will be considered a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceed-

ing five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment (in the case of a natural person) not exceeding six months, in the discretion of the court, as provided in the aforesaid law.

THE USE OF THE BEARING INDICATOR.

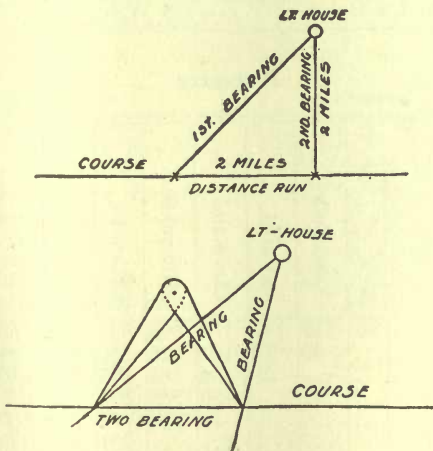
Presented with Compliments of Buffalo Lodge.

- (1) How to find error of the compass by the north star.
- (2) And by the rising and setting sun.
- (3) How to obtain the distance off from a light-house or other known objects by bearings known as the four-point bearing, the cross bearing or the two-bearing method which are thus explained.

(1) To obtain the error of the compass by a bearing of the north star: Set the dial of the indicator same as the pilot house compass, then point the sight-bar toward the north star and the indicator will show the error at once.

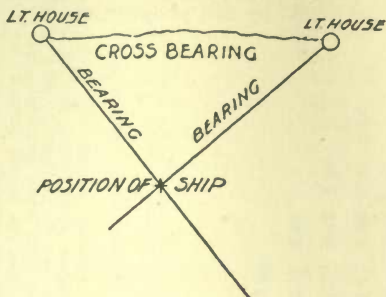
(2) By having the amplitude tables that have been published for the lake region, the error of the compass may be obtained by taking a bearing of the rising or setting sun.

The Four-Point Bearing.



The four-point bearing is the most simple and easy bearing to take that will give the exact distance off a light-house or other known object without having to use the chart, and is taken thus: For instance, your course is N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., set the sight bar at N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., or four (4) points of the bow; when the light-house or other object comes in range, note the time or log, or both, then run till the light-house or other object is abreast or eight (8) points of the bow, and the distance run between bearings will be the exact distance to the light-house.

The cross bearing is a very simple, quick and correct bearing when there are two light-houses in view, and is taken thus: Take a bearing of each light-house and draw them on the chart, and where the lines cross is the position of the ship.



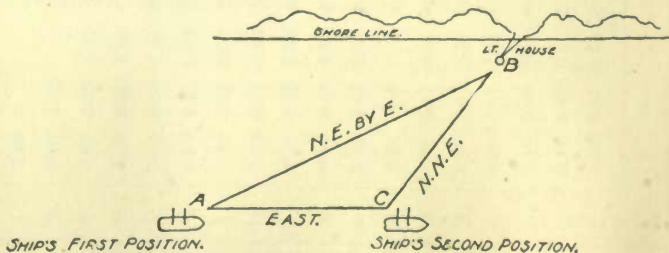
The two bearing method is taken thus: Take a bearing of light-house and draw the line on the chart, then run any distance, say a mile or two miles, then take another bearing, and draw it on the chart also, then set the dividers to the distance run, according to scale on chart, and draw them down the bearings on the course you have been steering till one point of the dividers rests on each line, and that will be the location of the ship at each bearing.

TO FIND A SHIP'S DISTANCE.

From a Point of Land or a Light, Without a Table, Chart or Dividers.

Submitted by Bro. F. B. Higgin.

The problem is of great service when sailing along any coast and is as follows: Suppose any well known shore light bears two or three points on either bow, then let the ship keep on her course till it bears the same number of points to the left of the first bearing; the distance the ship has run in the interval is her distance from the light at the time of taking the second bearing.



EXAMPLE.

Let A be a ship steering east; B a light bearing three points on the port bow, that is, N. E. by E. She proceeds on her course till the light bears three points to the left of N. E. by E., that is N. N. E., then C. B. is equal to C. A. by 6th proposition, first book of Euclid.

PILOT RULES FOR THE GREAT LAKES

And Their Connecting and Tributary Waters.

Rules and Regulations for the government of pilots of vessels propelled by steam, gas, fluid, naphtha, or electric motors, and of other vessels propelled by machinery, navigating the Great Lakes and their connecting and tributary waters as far east as Montreal, adopted by the Board of United States Supervising Inspectors, Steamboat Inspection Service, on February 14, 1907, and approved by the Secretary of Commerce and Labor on February 25, 1907, under the authority of an Act of Congress approved February 8, 1895.

These Rules Shall be Effective On and After July 1, 1907.

Preliminary.

In the following rules the words "steam vessel" and "steamer" shall include any vessel propelled by machinery.

A vessel is "under way" within the meaning of these rules when she is not at anchor or made fast to the shore or aground.

"Risk of collision" can, when circumstances permit, be ascertained by carefully watching the compass bearing of an approaching vessel. If the bearing does not appreciably change, such risk should be deemed to exist.

Signals.

Rule 1. In all weathers every steam vessel under way in taking any course authorized or required by these rules shall indicate that course by the following "signals" on her whistle, to be accompanied, whenever required, by corresponding alteration of her helm; and every steam vessel receiving a signal from another shall promptly respond with the same signal or sound the danger signal as provided in Rule II:

"One blast" means, "I am directing my course to starboard," except when two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely, other than when one steamer is overtaking another, one short blast signifies intention of steamer which is to starboard of the other to hold course and speed.

"Two blasts" mean, "I am directing my course to port," except that when two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely, other than when one steamer is overtaking another, two short blasts signify desire of or assent to steamer which is to port of the other to cross the bow of steamer to starboard.

Rule II. If, when steamers are approaching each other, the pilot of either vessel fails to understand the course or intention of the other, whether from signals being given or answered erroneously, or from other causes, the pilot so in doubt shall immediately signify the same by giving the "danger signal" of four or more short and rapid blasts of the whistle; and if both vessels shall have approached within half a mile of each other, both shall be immediately slowed to a speed barely sufficient for steerageway, and, if necessary, stopped and reversed, until the proper signals are given, answered, and understood, or until the vessels shall have passed each other.

Rule III. Steam vessels are forbidden to use what has become technically known among pilots as "cross signals"—that is, answering one whistle with two, and answering two whistles with one. In all cases, and under all circumstances, a pilot receiving either of the whistle signals provided in the rules, which for any reason he deems injudicious to comply with, instead of answering it with a cross signal, shall at once sound the danger signal and observe the rule applying thereto (Rule II).

Rule IV. The signals for passing, by the blowing of the whistle, shall be given and answered by pilots in compliance with these rules, not only when meeting "head and head," or nearly so, but at all times when passing or meeting at a distance within a half mile of each other, and whether passing to the starboard or port.

Situations.

Rule V. When steamers are approaching each other "head and head," or nearly so, it shall be the duty of each steamer to pass on the port side of the other; and the pilot of either steamer may be first in determining to pursue this course, and thereupon shall give, as a signal of his intention, one short and distinct blast of his whistle, which the pilot of the other steamer shall answer promptly by a similar blast of his whistle, and thereupon such steamers shall pass on the port side of each other. But if the courses of such steamers are so far on the starboard of each other as not to be considered by pilots as meeting "head and head," or nearly so, the pilot so first deciding shall immediately give two short and distinct blasts of his whistle, which the pilot of the other steamer shall answer promptly by two similar blasts of his whistle, and they shall pass on the starboard side of each other: Provided, however, That in all narrow channels where there is a current and in the rivers St. Mary, St. Clair, Detroit, Niagara, and St. Lawrence, when two steamers are meeting, the descending steamer shall have the right of way, and shall, before the vessels shall have arrived within the distance of one-half mile of each other, give the signal necessary to indicate which side she elects to take.

In the night, steamers will be considered as meeting "head and head" so long as both the colored lights of each are in view of the other.

Rule VI. Whenever a steamer is nearing a short bend or curve in the channel, where, from the height of the banks or other cause, a steamer approaching from the opposite direction cannot be seen for a distance of half a mile, the pilot of such steamer, when he shall have arrived within half a mile of such curve or bend, shall give a signal by one long blast of the whistle, which signal shall be answered by a similar blast, given by the pilot of any steamer within hearing that may be approaching on the other side, and within half a mile of such bend or curve. Should such signal be so answered by a steamer upon the further side of such bend, then the usual signals for meeting and passing shall immediately be given and answered; but if the first signal of such pilot be not answered, he is to consider the channel clear and govern himself accordingly.

Rule VII. When a steamer is moved from its dock or berth, and other steamers are liable to approach such steamer from any direction, such steamer and any approaching steamer shall give the same signals as in case of steamers meeting at a bend; but immediately after clearing the dock or berth as to be fully in sight they shall be governed by the rules for passing.

Rule VIII. When one steamer is overtaking another, and the pilot of a steamer which is astern shall desire to pass on the right or starboard hand of the steamer ahead, he shall give one short blast of the whistle, as a signal of such desire and intention, and shall put his helm to port; or if he shall desire to pass on the left or port side of the steamer ahead, he shall give two short blasts of the whistle as a signal of such desire and intention, and shall put his helm to starboard, and the pilot of the steamer ahead shall answer by the same signals; or if he does not think it safe for the steamer astern to attempt to pass at that point, he shall immediately signify the same by giving four or more short and rapid blasts of the whistle, and under no circumstances shall the steamer astern attempt to pass the steamer ahead until such time as they have reached a point where it can be safely done, when said steamer ahead shall signify her willingness by blowing the proper signals. The boat ahead shall in no case attempt to cross the bow or crowd upon the course of the passing steamer.

Every vessel coming up with another vessel from any direction more than two points abaft her beam—that is, in such a position, with reference to the vessel which she is overtaking, that at night she would be unable to see either of that vessel's side lights—shall be deemed to be an overtaking vessel; and no subsequent alteration of the bearing between the two vessels shall make the overtaking vessel a crossing vessel within the meaning of these rules, or relieve her of the duty of keeping clear of the overtaken vessel until she is finally passed and clear.

As by day the overtaking vessel cannot always know with certainty whether she is forward of or abaft this direction from the other vessel, she should, if in doubt, assume that she is an overtaking vessel and keep out of the way.

Rule IX. In all channels less than five hundred feet in width, no steam vessel shall pass another going in the same direction unless the steam vessel ahead shall be disabled or signify her willingness that the steam vessel astern shall pass, when the steam vessel astern may pass, subject, however, to the other rules applicable to such a situation. And when steam vessels proceeding in opposite directions are about to meet in such channels, both such vessels shall be slowed down to a moderate speed, according to the circumstances.

Rule X. When two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely so as to involve risk of collision, other than when one steamer is overtaking another, the steamer which has the other on her own port side shall hold her course and speed; and the steamer which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other by directing her course to starboard so as to cross the stern of the other steamer, or, if necessary to do so, slacken her speed or stop or reverse. The steamer having the other on her own port bow shall blow one blast of her whistle as a signal of her intention to cross the bow of the other, holding her course and speed, which signal shall be promptly answered by the other steamer by one short blast of her whistle as a signal of her intention to direct her course to starboard so as to cross the stern of the other steamer or otherwise keep clear.

If from any cause whatever the conditions covered by this situation are such as to prevent immediate compliance with each other's signals, the misunderstanding or objection shall be at once made apparent by blowing the danger signal, and both steamers shall be stopped, and backed if necessary, until signals for passing with safety are made and understood.

Rule XI. When two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely, other than when one steamer is overtaking another, so that the steamer having the other on her own starboard side may cross the bow of the other, without involving risk of collision, the steamer having the other on her own starboard side may cross the bow of the other. If the steamers are within half a mile of each other the steamer having the other on her own starboard side shall give, as a signal of her intention to cross the bow of the other, two short and distinct blasts of her whistle, which, if assented to, the other steamer shall promptly answer by two similar blasts of her whistle, when the steamer having the other on her own starboard bow may cross the bow of the other, in which case the steamer

having the other on her own port side shall keep out of the way of the other. If, however, the steamer having the other on her own port side deems it dangerous for the other steamer to cross her bow, she shall sound the danger signal, in which case both steamers shall be stopped, and backed if necessary, until signals for passing with safety are made, answered, and understood.

Rule XII. When a steam vessel and a sailing vessel are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision the steam vessel shall keep out of the way of the sailing vessel.

Rule XIII. In obeying and construing these rules due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation and collision and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

Fog Signals.

Rule XIV. Whenever there is thick weather by reason of fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain storms, or other causes, whether by day or by night, fog signals shall be used as follows:

A steam vessel under way, excepting only a steam vessel with raft in tow, shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute three distinct blasts of her whistle.

A steamer with a raft in tow shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute a screeching or Modoc whistle for from three to five seconds.

Every vessel in tow of another vessel shall, at intervals of one minute, sound four bells on a good and efficient and properly placed bell as follows: By striking the bell twice in quick succession, followed by a little longer interval, and then again striking twice in quick succession (in the manner in which four bells is struck in indicating time).

Any vessel at anchor and any vessel aground in or near a channel or fairway shall, at intervals of not more than two minutes, ring the bell rapidly for three to five seconds.

Speed to be Moderate in Fog, and so Forth.

Rule XV. Every steam vessel shall, in thick weather, by reason of fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain storms, or other causes, go at moderate speed. A steam vessel hearing, apparently not more than four points from right ahead, the fog signal of another vessel, shall at once reduce her speed to bare steerageway, and navigate with caution until the vessels shall have passed each other.

Posting of Pilot Rules.

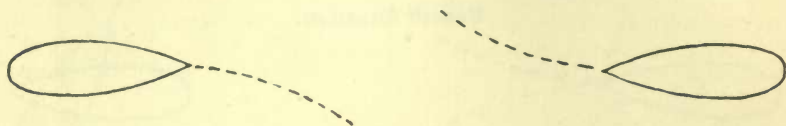
On steam and other motor vessels of over 100 gross tons, two copies of the placard form of these rules (Form 807) shall be kept

posted up in conspicuous places in the vessel, one copy of which shall be kept posted up in the pilot house. On steam and other motor vessels of over 25 gross tons and not over 100 gross tons, two copies of the placard form of pilot rules shall be kept on board, one copy of which shall be kept posted up in the pilot house. On steam and other motor vessels of 25 gross tons and under, two copies of the placard form of pilot rules shall be kept on board, and, where practicable, one copy thereof shall be kept conspicuously posted up in the vessel. (Authority: Section 3, act of Congress approved February 8, 1895.)

Diagrams.

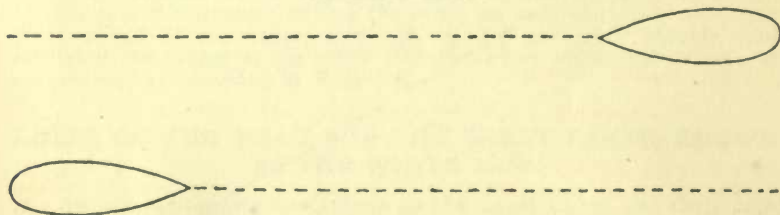
The following diagrams are intended to illustrate the working of the system of colored lights and pilot rules:

First Situation.



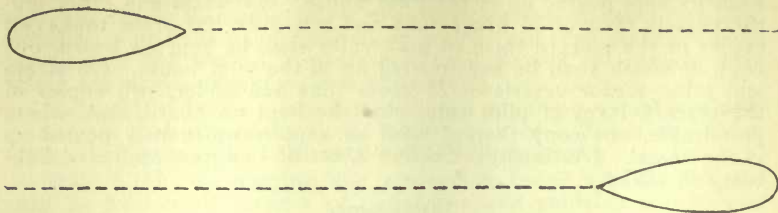
Here the two colored lights visible to each will indicate their direct approach "head and head" toward each other. In this situation it is a standing rule that both shall put their helms to port and pass on the port side of each other, each having previously given one blast of the whistle.

Second Situation.



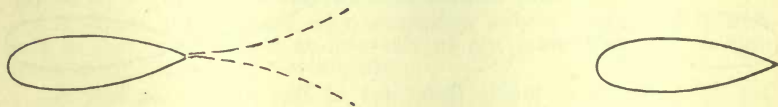
In this situation the red light only will be visible to each, the screens preventing the green lights from being seen. Both vessels are evidently passing to port of each other, which is rulable in this situation, each pilot having previously signified his intention by one blast of the whistle.

Third Situation.



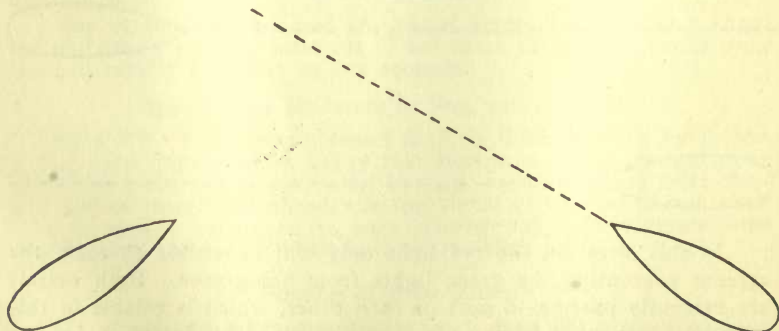
In this situation the green light only will be visible to each, the screens preventing the red light from being seen. They are therefore passing to starboard of each other, which is rutable in this situation, each pilot having previously signified his intention by two blasts of the whistle.

Fourth Situation.



In this situation one steamer is overtaking another steamer from some point within the angle of two points abaft the beams of the overtaken steamer. The overtaking steamer may pass on the starboard or port side of the steamer ahead after the necessary signals for passing have been given, with assent of the overtaken steamer, as prescribed in Rule VIII.

Fifth Situation.



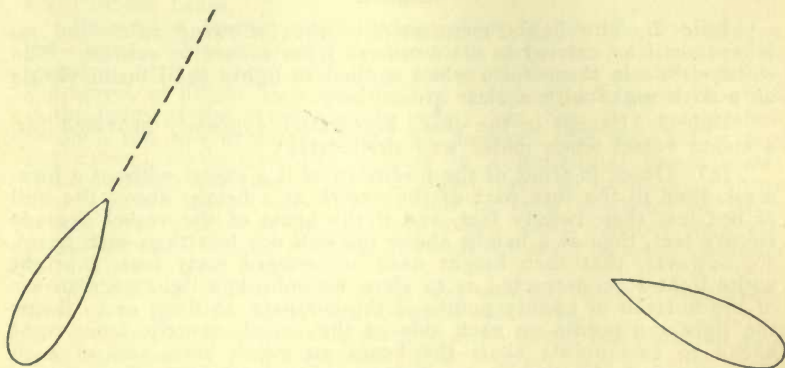
In this situation two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely in such manner as to involve risk of col-

lson, other than where one steamer is overtaking another.

The steamer which has the other on her own port side shall hold course and speed, and the other shall keep clear by crossing astern of the steamer that is holding course and speed, or if necessary to do so, shall slacken her speed or stop or reverse.

Both steamers shall otherwise observe the provisions of Rule X with respect to the signals for passing and the danger signal.

Sixth Situation.



In this situation two steamers are approaching each other at right angles or obliquely without involving risk of collision, the course and speed of both being such as would clearly allow the steamer having the other on own starboard side to cross the bow of the other without interfering with the course and speed of the other. In this case the steamer having the other on own starboard side may cross ahead of the other, after giving the necessary signals, and receiving the assent of the other steamer, when within half a mile of each other, as provided in Rule XI.

RULES OF THE ROAD FOR THE GREAT LAKES, KNOWN AS THE WHITE LAW.

An act to regulate navigation on the Great Lakes and their connecting and tributary waters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following rules for preventing collisions shall be followed in the navigation of all public and private vessels of the United States upon the Great Lakes and their connecting and tributary waters as far east as Montreal.

Steam and Sail Vessels.

Rule 1. Every steam vessel which is under sail and not under steam shall be considered a sail vessel; and every steam vessel which is under steam, whether under sail or not, shall be considered a steam vessel. The word steam vessel shall include any vessel propelled by machinery. A vessel is under way within the meaning of these rules when she is not at anchor or made fast to the shore, or aground.

Lights.

Rule 2. The lights mentioned in the following rules and no others shall be carried in all weathers from sunset to sunrise. The word visible in these rules when applied to lights shall mean visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere.

Rule 3. Except in the cases hereinafter expressly provided for, a steam vessel when under way shall carry:

(a) On or in front of the foremast, or if a vessel without a foremast, then in the fore part of the vessel, at a height above the hull of not less than twenty feet, and if the beam of the vessel exceeds twenty feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such beam, so, however, that such height need not exceed forty feet, a bright white light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twenty points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light ten points on each side of the vessel, namely, from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such character as to be visible at a distance of at least five miles.

(b) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two miles.

(c) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two miles.

(d) The said green and red lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

(e) A steamer of over one hundred and fifty feet register length shall also carry when under way an additional bright light similar in construction to that mentioned in subdivision (a), so fixed as to throw the light all around the horizon and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least three miles. Such additional light shall be placed in line with the keel at least fifteen feet higher from the deck and more than seventy-five feet abaft the light mentioned in subdivision (a).

Vessels Towing.

Rule 4. A steam vessel having a tow other than a raft shall in addition to the forward bright light mentioned in subdivision (a) of rule three, carry in a vertical line not less than six feet above or below that light a second bright light of the same construction and character and fixed and carried in the same manner as the forward bright light mentioned in said subdivision (a) of rule three. Such steamer shall also carry a small bright light abaft the funnel or after mast for the tow to steer by, but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam.

Rule 5. A steam vessel having a raft in tow shall, instead of the forward lights mentioned in rule four, carry on or in front of the foremast, or if a vessel without a foremast, then in the fore part of the vessel, at height above the hull of not less than twenty feet and if the beam of the vessel exceeds twenty feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such beam, so, however, that such height need not exceed forty feet, two brights in a horizontal line athwartships and not less than eight feet apart, each so fixed as to throw the light all around the horizon and of such character as to be visible at a distance of at least five miles. Such steamer shall also carry the small bright steering light aft, of the character and fixed as required in rule four.

Rule 6. A sailing vessel under way and any vessel being towed shall carry the side lights mentioned in rule three.

A vessel in tow shall also carry a small bright light aft, but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam.

Rule 7. The lights for tugs under thirty tons register, whose principal business is harbor towing and for boats navigating only on the River St. Lawrence, also ferryboats, rafts, and canal boats, shall be regulated by rules which have been or may hereafter be prescribed by the Board of Supervising Inspectors of Steam Vessels.

Rule 8. Whenever, as in the case of small vessels under way during bad weather, the green and red side lights cannot be fixed, these lights shall be kept at hand lighted and ready for use, and shall, on the approach of or to other vessels, be exhibited on their respective sides in sufficient time to prevent collision, in such manner as to make them most visible, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side, nor, if practicable, more than two points abaft the beam, on their respective sides. To make the use of these portable lights more certain and easy, they shall each be painted outside with the color of the light they respectively contain, and shall be provided with suitable screens.

Rule 9. A vessel under one hundred and fifty feet register length when at anchor, shall carry forward, where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull, a white light in a lantern constructed so as to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light, visible all around the horizon, at a distance of at least one mile.

A vessel of one hundred and fifty feet or upward in register length, when at anchor, shall carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height of not less than twenty and not exceeding forty feet above the hull, one such light, and at or near the stern of the vessel, and at such a height that it shall be not less than fifteen feet lower than the forward light, another such light.

Rule 10. Produce boats, canal boats, fishing boats, rafts, or other water craft navigating any bay, harbor, or river by hand power, horse power, sail, or by the current of the river, or which shall be anchored or moored in or near the channel or fairway of any bay, harbor, or river, and not otherwise provided for in these rules, shall carry one or more good white lights, which shall be placed in such manner as shall be prescribed by the Board of Supervising Inspectors of Steam Vessels.

Rule 11. Open boats shall not be obliged to carry the side lights required for other vessels, but shall, if they do not carry such lights, carry a lantern having a green slide on one side and a red slide on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, and in such a manner that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side. Open boats, when at anchor or stationary, shall exhibit a bright white light. They shall not, however, be prevented from using a flare-up in addition if considered expedient.

Rule 12. Sailing vessels shall at all times, on the approach of any steamer during the night-time, show a lighted torch upon that point or quarter to which such steamer shall be approaching.

Rule 13. The exhibition of any light on board of a vessel of war or revenue cutter of the United States may be suspended whenever, in the opinion of the Secretary of the Navy, the commander in chief of a squadron, or the commander of a vessel acting singly, the special character of the service may require it.

Fog Signals.

Rule 14. A steam vessel shall be provided with an efficient whistle, sounded by steam or by some substitute for steam, placed before the funnel not less than eight feet from the deck, or in such other place as the local inspectors of steam vessels shall determine, and of such character as to be heard in ordinary weather at a distance of at least two miles, and with an efficient bell, and it is hereby made the duty of the United States local inspectors of steam vessels when inspecting the same to require each steamer to be furnished with such whistle and bell. A sailing vessel shall be provided with an efficient fog horn and with an efficient bell.

Whenever there is thick weather by reason of fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rainstorms, or other causes, whether by day or by night, fog signals shall be used as follows:

(a) A steam vessel under way, excepting only a steam vessel with raft in tow, shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute three distinct blasts of her whistle.

(b) Every vessel in tow of another vessel shall, at intervals of one minute, sound four bells on a good and efficient and properly placed bell as follows: By striking the bell twice in quick succession, followed by a little longer interval, and then again striking twice in quick succession (in the manner in which four bells is struck in indicating time).

(c) A steamer with a raft in tow shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute a screeching or Modoc whistle for from three to five seconds.

(d) A sailing vessel under way and not in tow shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute—

If on the starboard tack with wind forward of abeam, one blast of her fog horn;

If on the port tack with wind forward of the beam, two blasts of her fog horn;

If she has the wind abaft the beam on either side, three blasts of her fog horn.

(e) Any vessel at anchor and any vessel aground in or near a channel or fairway shall at intervals of not more than two minutes ring the bell rapidly for three to five seconds.

(f) Vessels of less than 10 tons registered tonnage not being steam vessels, shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals, but if they do not they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.

(g) Produce boats, fishing boats, rafts, or other water craft navigating by hand power or by current of the river, or anchored or moored in or near the channel or fairway and not in any port, and not otherwise provided for in these rules, shall sound a fog horn, or equivalent signal, at intervals of not more than one minute.

Rule 15. Every vessel shall, in thick weather, by reason of fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain storms, or other causes, go at moderate speed. A steam vessel hearing, apparently not more than four points from right ahead, the fog signal of another vessel shall at once reduce her speed to bare steerage way, and navigate with caution until the vessels shall have passed each other.

STEERING AND SAILING RULES.

Sailing Vessels.

Rule 16. When two sailing vessels are approaching one another so as to involve risk of collision one of them shall keep out of the way of the other, as follows, namely:

(a) A vessel which is running free shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close hauled.

(b) A vessel which is close hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close hauled on the starboard tack.

(c) When both are running free, with the wind on different sides, the vessel which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.

(d) When they are running free, with the wind on the same side, the vessel which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is to leeward.

Steam Vessels.

Rule 17. When two steam vessels are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard., so that each shall pass on the port side of the other.

Rule 18. When two steam vessels are crossing so as to involve risk of collision the vessel which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.

Rule 19. When a steam vessel and a sailing vessel are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision the steam vessel shall keep out of the way of the sailing vessel.

Rule 20. Where, by any of the rules herein prescribed, one of two vessels shall keep out of the way, the other shall keep her course and speed.

Rule 21. Every steam vessel which is directed by these rules to keep out of the way of another vessel shall, on approaching her, if necessary, slacken her speed or stop or reverse.

Rule 22. Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules every vessel overtaking any other shall keep out of the way of the overtaken vessel.

Rule 23. In all weathers every steam vessel under way in taking any course authorized or required by these rules shall indicate that course by the following signals on her whistle, to be accompanied whenever required by corresponding alteration of her helm; and every steam vessel receiving a signal from another shall promptly respond with the same signal, or, as provided in Rule Twenty-six:

One blast to mean, "I am directing my course to starboard."

Two blasts to mean, "I am directing my course to port." But the giving or answering signals by a vessel required to keep her course shall not vary the duties and obligations of the respective vessels.

Rule 24. That in all narrow channels where there is a current, and in the rivers Saint Mary, Saint Clair, Detroit, Niagara, and Saint Lawrence, when two steamers are meeting, the descending steamer shall have the right of way, and shall, before the vessels shall have arrived within the distance of one-half mile of each other, give the signal necessary to indicate which side she elects to take.

Rule 25. In all channels less than five hundred feet in width, no steam vessel shall pass another going in the same direction unless the

steam vessel ahead be disabled or signify her willingness that the steam vessel astern shall pass, when the steam vessel astern may pass, subject however, to the other rules applicable to such a situation. And when steam vessels proceeding in opposite directions are about to meet in such channels, both such vessels shall be slowed down to a moderate speed, according to the circumstances.

Rule 26. If the pilot of a steam vessel to which a passing signal is sounded, deems it unsafe to accept and assent to said signal, he shall not sound a cross signal; but in that case, and in every case where the pilot of one steamer fails to understand the course or intention of an approaching steamer, whether from signals being given or answered erroneously, or from other causes, the pilot of such steamer so receiving the first passing signal, or the pilot so in doubt, shall sound several short and rapid blasts of the whistle; and if the vessels shall have approached within half a mile of each other both shall reduce their speed to bare steerageway, and, if necessary, stop and reverse.

Rule 27. In obeying and construing these rules due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation and collision and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

Rule 28. Nothing in these rules shall exonerate any vessel, or the owner or master or crew thereof, from the consequences of any neglect to carry lights or signals, or of any neglect to keep a proper lookout, or of a neglect of any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen, or by the special circumstances of the case.

Sec. 2. That a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars may be imposed for the violation of any of the provisions of this act. The vessel shall be liable for the said penalty, and may be seized and proceeded against, by way of libel, in the district court of the United States for any district within which such vessel may be found.

Sec. 3. That the Secretary of Commerce and Labor of the United States shall have authority to establish all necessary regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of this act, required to carry the same into effect.

The Board of Supervising Inspectors of the United States shall have authority to establish such regulations to be observed by all steam vessels in passing each other, not inconsistent with the provisions of this act, as they shall from time to time deem necessary; and all regulations adopted by the said Board of Supervising Inspectors under the authority of this act, when approved by the Secretary of Commerce and Labor shall have the force of law. Two printed copies of any such regulations for passing, signed by them, shall be furnished to each steam vessel, and shall at all times be kept posted up in conspicuous places on board.

Sec. 4. That all laws or parts of laws, so far as applicable to the navigation of the Great Lakes and their connecting and tributary waters as far east as Montreal, inconsistent with the foregoing rules are hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. That this act shall take effect on and after March first, eighteen hundred and ninety-five.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE MOVEMENTS AND ANCHORAGE OF VESSELS.

Rule 1. Speed.—No vessel navigating the St. Mary's river shall proceed at a greater speed than 10 statute miles per hour over the ground between Everens Point and the northern float lights in lower Hay Lake, marking the end of the Middle Neebish Channel, nor between the cribs in Mud Lake and the cribs in Hay Lake, marking the lower and upper ends, respectively, of the West Neebish Channel, nor between the crib light in upper Hay Lake opposite Sixmile Point and the dike at Bayfield Shoal, nor between the western end of St. Mary's Falls Canal and Big Point.

Vessels of 500 tons or less are exempt from the provisions of this rule.

Vessels navigating the St. Mary's River may proceed at full speed and pass other vessels moving in the same direction between Point Detour and the Mud Lake beacon in the northern part of Mud Lake, and in deep water in Hay Lake. Upbound vessels may also proceed at full speed and pass other vessels going in the same direction between Mud Lake beacon and Everens Point.

No vessel passing another vessel shall move at a rate of speed greater than ten statute miles per hour over the ground. (See also Rule V.)

Rule II. Middle and West Neebish channels.—No upbound vessels shall pass the St. Mary's River by the way of the West Neebish Channel, and no downbound vessels shall pass by way of the Middle Neebish Channel, except vessels of 500 tons or less and vessels making regular local stops on these channels.

Rule III. Upbound vessels passing.—Upbound vessels shall not pass other vessels moving in the same direction between Everens Point and the red gas buoy at lower end of Little Mud Lake on the Dark Hole range, nor between the second red spar buoy east of the Middle Neebish Channel in Hay Lake, nor between the crib light in upper Hay Lake opposite Sixmile Point and the dike at Bayfield Shoal, nor between the west end of St. Mary's Falls Canal pier and Big Point.

Upbound vessels may pass other vessels going in the same direction in Mud Lake below Everens Point and in deep water in Hay Lake.

Rule IV. Downbound vessels passing.—Downbound vessels shall not pass other vessels moving in the same direction between Big Point and the St. Mary's Falls Canal, nor between the dike at Bayfield Shoal and the crib light in upper Hay Lake opposite Sixmile Point, nor between the crib lights in lower Hay Lake, marking the entrance to the West Neebish Channel, and the crib lights marking the lower end of the West Neebish Channel near the Mud Lake beacon.

Downbound vessels may pass other vessels going in the same direction in deep water in Hay Lake and in Mud Lake below the Mud Lake beacon.

Rule 5. In case one steamer desires to pass another going in the same direction on said river, at a point where such passing is permitted by these rules, the pilot of the steamer astern shall, if he intends to pass the steamer ahead on the right hand or starboard side, indicate such intention by giving one short blast of the steam whistle, and if he intends to pass such steamer ahead on the left hand or port side, he shall indicate such intention by giving two short blasts of the steam whistle. Upon the pilot of one steamer astern of another giving such signal, the pilot of the steamer ahead shall immediately answer by giving the same signal; but if he does not think it safe for the steamer astern to attempt to pass at that point, he shall immediately signify the same by giving several short and rapid blasts of the steam whistle; and under no circumstances shall the steamer astern attempt to pass the steamer ahead until such time as they have reached a point where it can be safely done, when said steamer ahead shall signify her willingness by blowing the proper signals; then the steamer ahead shall slacken to a slow rate of speed, and the steamer astern shall pass the overtaken steamer, giving the overtaken steamer as wide a berth as possible.

Steamers bound in opposite directions shall slow to half speed within one-quarter of a mile of each other until each has passed the other.

Rule 6.—The patrolling vessels of the revenue cutter service shall always have the right of way over all other vessels, as indicated by the sailing signals given by any such patrolling vessel.

Rule 7.—Three distinct blasts of the steam whistle, when sounded from a patrolling vessel, will indicate that the vessel to which such signal is given is proceeding at too high rate of speed, and such vessel must immediately moderate her speed accordingly.

Rule 8.—Four long blasts of the steam whistle, when sounded from a patrolling vessel, will indicate that the vessel to which such signal is given must stop until further orders from the patrolling vessel.

Rule 9.—Two red lanterns, one above the other, hoisted on a patrolling vessel at night, will indicate to the vessel to which such

signal is given that such vessel must stop and not proceed farther toward the position where such lights are displayed.

Rule 10.—No vessel or raft shall anchor in any of the improved channels now abreast of the government piers at Saulte Ste. Marie, except in distress or during a fog, and any vessel so anchored must always shift her anchorage when so directed by the officer in charge of a patrolling vessel to the spot designated by such officer.

Rule 11.—Vessels navigating the St. Mary's river may anchor between Point Detour and Mud Lake turning buoy, and at Sailors' Encampment close to the wharves of the sawmill; in Hay Lake between the Neebish and Little Rapids channel outside of the channel as indicated by the ranges, but nothing in this rule shall be construed to prohibit any vessel from lying alongside of any wharf in said river.

Rule 12.—Rafts being towed in the St. Marys river will be required to use what is termed the "old or St. George channel." From Harwood point to Mud Lake turning buoy they will move at the time designated by the officer in charge of the patrolling vessel. When lying by they must be moored out of the channel.

Rule 13.—In navigating the St. Marys River, in all cases where the foregoing rules are not applicable, the attention of masters and pilots is called to the sailing rules contained in the act of Congress of Feb. 8, 1895.

Rule 14.—All vessels navigating the St. Marys river, in passing dredges and vessels at work on improvements to the channel, will be required to slacken their speed upon such dredge or other vessels engaged in such improvement giving the signal of three distinct blasts of the steam whistle.

Rule 15.—The pilot of every steamer descending the St. Marys river shall, when abreast of the Dark Hole gas buoy, and before passing around the bend of said river at Sailors' Encampment, give a signal of one blast of the steam whistle of 10 seconds' duration, which signal shall be answered by a blast of the steam whistle of the same duration by any vessel ascending said river within hearing. The pilot of every steamer ascending said river, not having heard such signal from a descending steamer, shall, when abreast of Everens Point, and before passing around the bend of said river at Sailors' Encampment, give a signal of one blast of the steam whistle of 10 seconds' duration, which shall be answered by a blast of the steam whistle of the same duration by any vessel descending said river within hearing. After such signal of one blast of the steam whistle of 10 seconds' duration shall have been given and answered, the usual passing signal must be given.

Vessels of 500 tons or less and local boats are alone permitted to pass down this channel.

Rule 16.—Any steamer approaching a tug towing a dredge or scow moving in the same direction may pass such tow by giving the

proper signal indicating upon which side of such tow such steamer will pass, and it shall be the duty of the pilot of any such tug to sheer on the side of the channel indicated by such passing signal and give the passing steamer all possible room.

Rule 17.—No steamer stemming the current through the Dyke and Island Cut shall be allowed to tow more than one vessel without the aid of a tug unless such steamer has the power to move the tow over the ground at the rate of at least four miles an hour.

Rule 18.—No steamer navigating the St. Mary's river, either ascending or descending, shall pass another steamer or steamers moving either in the same or opposite direction, in such a position that more than two steamers shall be abreast of each other when thus passing. In case three steamers are liable to pass in a position where more than two of them will be abreast in passing, the overtaking steamer shall check its speed within a quarter of a mile of the overtaken steamer in order to avoid passing in such position.

These regulations shall take effect on and after the opening of the West Neebish channel.
